#### **Book ownership**

383,775

children and young people in the UK **don't have a single book of their own** at home

## Disadvantaged children are more likely to **not have** a book of their own

than their more
advantaged peers
(9.3% vs 6%)

**1 in 11** disadvantaged children in the UK don't own a single book

#### **Benefits of book ownership**

Children who have books of their own are more likely to enjoy reading and have higher reading skills

than their peers who don't own books

Compared to children who don't have a book of their own, **children who own books are**:

- six times more likely to read above the level expected for their age (22% vs 3.6%)\*
- nearly three times more likely to enjoy reading (56.2% vs 18.4%)

## **Closing the gap**

In the past six years, the gap between the number of disadvantaged **children** and their more advantaged peers **who don't own a book has halved** (from 6.1 percentage points in 2013 to 3.3 percentage points in 2019) In the past six years, we have gifted

more **340,000** 

books to children and young people who need them most **through our programmes**, **partnerships and Literacy Hubs** 

These finding are based on the National Literacy Trust's ninth Annual Literacy Survey. We surveyed 56,906 children and young people aged 9-18 from across the UK between January and March 2019.

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
